

# Time Alone with God

## Week 5

Write the questions in your QUIET TIME JOURNAL and then read the passage and answer according to what the Holy Spirit reveals to you!

### Day 1

Read [Genesis 6:1-8](#).

- How would you describe the condition of the world in Noah's day?
- How would you describe the condition of our world today?
- What set Noah apart?
- How would God describe your relationship with Him and your lifestyle, attitudes, and actions?

### Day 2

Read [Genesis 6:9-22](#).

- Search the Internet or other source for an illustration of Noah's ark. Why was it so big?
- Try to picture how large the ark was: one-and-a-half football fields long; as wide as three-quarters of a football field's length; as tall as a five-story building.
- What is the most difficult thing God has ever asked you to do?

### Day 3

Review [Genesis 7:1-8:14](#).

- Why did it rain so long?
- What is the most remarkable thing you discover in these verses?

### Day 4

Read [Genesis 8:15-22](#).

- What was the first thing Noah and his family did when they left the ark?
- Why was this an appropriate response?
- When was the last time you stopped to worship God (without being in a church worship service)?
- Spend some time today praising God for His love, protection, and guidance in your life.

### Day 5

Read [Genesis 9:1-17](#).

- What is God's covenant with us in these verses?
- Why is this covenant important?
- Write a short poem or prayer of praise thanking God for His love as evidenced in a rainbow.

### Day 6

Read [Genesis 9:20-29](#).

- What could Ham have done differently?
- What was the result of the curse on Canaan? (*The Canaanites eventually became an enemy to the Israelites.*)
- How can your choices, positive or negative, have an impact on others?
- Is there a sin you need to confess today?

### Day 7

Read [Genesis 10-11](#).

- What was wrong with the attitude of the people at the building of the tower?
- How is this attitude similar to [Genesis 3](#) and [1 John 2:15-16](#)?
- How did the sinful attitude of the people affect life on earth to this day?
